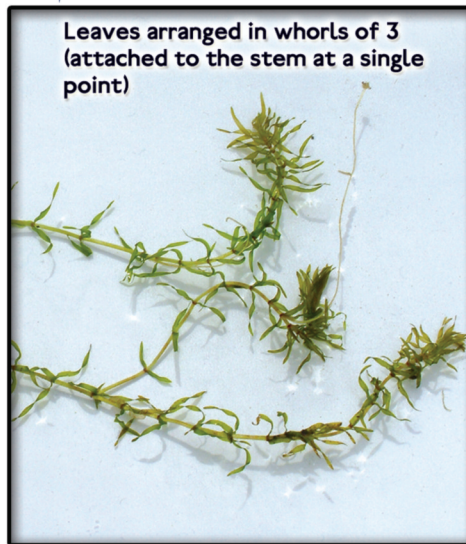

Dense canopy vegetation on water surface in Carrigadrohid Reservoir



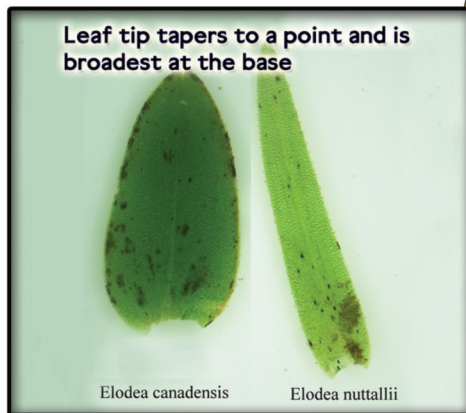
Leaves arranged in whorls of 3 (attached to the stem at a single point)



Leaves are normally strongly recurved



Leaf tip tapers to a point and is broadest at the base

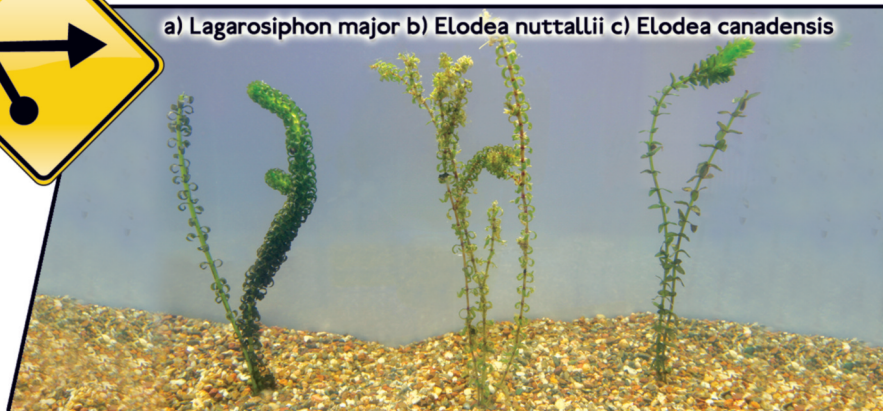

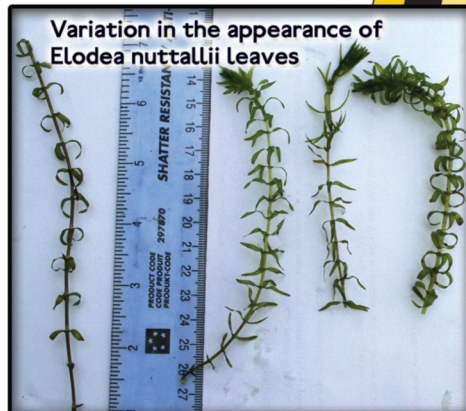
